About the festival

From January 5-9, 2011, The Waimea Ocean Film Festival will take place across multiple venues in the town of Waimea, at the Mauna Kea Beach Hotel, and along the Kohala Coast. With stunning films, speakers, art, sunrise yoga, paddling lessons, events and insight into Hawaiian culture, these five days will offer an immersive experience unique to the islands.

A smaller, and more intimate, version will show again at Four Seasons Resort Hualalai January 13-15.

The entire festival opens with a gala at the Four Seasons Resort Hualalai on January 5, hosting a multimedia journey of our world by Kenji Williams. Producer Jake Eberts will introduce and say a few words about the film "Oceans," as well as the ocean itself, and director Tom Shadyac will speak about his new film "I Am," as a preview of what's to come during the festival.

Festival speakers include photographer Flip Nicklin, to talk about his work with humpback whales, author and speaker Rod Nash, to speak on the ocean as wilderness, filmmaker Andy Carlson, Odie Sumi and Team Livestrong to talk about paddling and the Molokai Hoe, and Clark Little, to speak after his film, "The Shorebreak Art of Clark Little."

Other filmmakers on hand for Q&As during the festival include Suzan Beraza, Michael Nash, Jonno Durrant and Michelle Addington.

Festival art exhibits include a work in progress by artist Aurora Robson, made from plastic debris collected on Kamilo Beach as part of a volunteer clean-up; an exhibit of photography by the National Geographic photographer who traveled with the Hokulea to Tahiti in 1976; and an exhibit of local artists, including Mike Fields, Andy Carlson and Charlotte Nairn.
